VOCATIONS COMMITTEE

Each month, as part of the Traveling Chalice Program, we share information about a vocation. This month, we focus on Deacons.

In the Catholic Church, Permanent Deacons are single or married ordained men. We're lucky enough to have Deacons Joe, Tony, and Bill in our Parish. Permanent Deacons, especially those who are married, have secular jobs to support their families and also help the local pastor by doing things such as visiting the sick, teaching our faith, counseling couples and individuals, and working on parish committees. Deacons can baptize, witness marriages, perform funeral and burial services outside of Mass, distribute Holy Communion, and preach the homily. As a general rule, the priorities of a Permanent Deacon are #1 Family, #2 Work (because it supports their family) and #3 the Church. In retirement, the Church moves up to #2.

Transitional Deacons are seminarians in the last phase of preparing for the priesthood (such as Steve Marchand and/or Joe Sanderson who served at our Parish). After being a Deacon for a year, they can be ordained a priest by the Bishop.
